



What is a Safe Space?

In educational institutions a "safe space" has been used to indicate that a teacher, educational institution, or student body is resolved to not tolerate anti-LGBT violence, harassment or hate speech, thereby creating a safe place for all LGBT students.

The term "safe space" has been extended to refer to an autonomous space for individuals who feel marginalized to come together to communicate regarding their experiences with marginalization, typically on school campuses.
