Mindsets in the Classroom K/1 In Class Lesson

Lesson Title: Draw a picture of what you think your brain looks like?

Goal: Evaluate what students know already about the brain

Follow-up: Have students share their pictures and thoughts and then teach about the parts of the brain and what it does.

Materials: Pencil, markers, and paper with head outline drawn on it

Procedures:

- 1. Introduction: Explain to the class that we are going to be learning about the brain.
- 2. Pass out the head outline paper (I printed one off clip art) and ask them to draw or write about what their brains look like.
- 3. Collect papers
- 4. Call some students up to share what they think the brain looks like and why they think they way that they do,
- 5. Show a video or use a picture of what the brain looks like and talk about what the different parts do. (I downloaded a TPT whole body unit)
- 6. Talk about neurons and the central nervous system
- 7. Have children then do a follow up picture about what they think the brain looks like and compare them to the first drawings and writings.

Note: Since I teach k/1, I did this over several days since they loose focus fast. We also did a think, pair, share discussion and a KWL chart as a class throughout the week.
