OVERVIEW & PURPOSE

Students will identify the causes, effects, and results of the American Revolution.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Identify causes and effects that led to the American Revolution
- 2. Create a page for an ABC book of the American Revolution

VERIFICATION

Steps to check for student understanding

- 1. Students will form a judgement about which cause would bother them most as a colonist.
- 2. Students will discuss if they would be a loyalist or patriot and why.
- 3. Students create a page showing their understanding of some aspect leading up to or during the American Revolution.

ACTIVITY

Describe activities that will reinforce the lesson (30 minute lessons)

Day One:

- 1. As a class, read pages 130-131.
- 2. Watch <u>www.brainpop.com</u> Causes of the American Revolution.
- 3. Watch a second time, stopping to add causes and effects to the Cause/Effect Graphic Organizer.

Day 2:

- 1. In groups, have students discuss which cause of the American Revolution would have bothered them the most as a colonist and why.
- 2. Finish reading text pages 131-132 about the battles of the American Revolution
- 3. Watch <u>www.brainpop.com</u> American Revolution.

Days 3 and 4:

- 1. In groups, have students discuss whether they think they would have been a loyalist or a patriot and why if they were a colonist during the American Revolution.
- 2. Assign a letter of the alphabet to students.
 - Each student should write a word or phrase using that letter that is related to the American Revolution.
 - Write a sentence explaining its connection to the event.
 - then draw an illustration supporting their text.
