7th Grade ELA Lesson

Summary

- 2. Novel Study: Downriver, by Will Hobbs
- 3. 7th Grade
- 4. Objective: Students will evaluate the choices made by the teens in the novel and make personal connections to the characters
- 5. 90 minute block

Implementation

Learning Context

This lesson comes at the end of the novel- students have spent time each day reflecting on the events and characters

Procedure

a. Anticipatory Set

Do Now: The teens in the novel made a number of very dangerous decisions- share a time (or times) when you, a friend, a sibling, or an older acquaintance behaved in a way that ended up being a bad idea

2. Direct Instruction

What's going on in our brains? Why does it seem like teens tend to make some really questionable choices? Watch the following videos and pause for discussion:
